Colorectal Cancer

Colorectal cancer (CRC) is the **third most commonly diagnosed** cancer in the world. Worldwide incidence is expected to increase from 1.9 million cases diagnosed in 2020 to **3.1 million cases by 2040**.



Some cases of CRC are microsatellite instability-high (MSI-H) or DNA mismatch repair deficient (dMMR), which occurs when there are deficiencies in the cell's ability to repair DNA errors during cell division. Patients with these subtypes often have a poor prognosis with lower survival rates. Patients with advanced forms of CRC have fewer treatment options and lower survival rates. About 4-5% of patients with metastatic CRC have MSI-H or dMMR tumors.
